



1.55 YOTA LC CLASSIC **Rear Beadlock Wheels**


Option 2



1. Use the bigger spacer (5x8x2.5) to space out the center wheel nut for a more realistic look.



2. Secure the six screws with the nuts provided to replicate wheel nuts.



3. Using the multi tool screw in the center hub cap. Make sure its tightened and secure by putting a driver that fits through the hole for a bit more leverage. (Note do not over tight as this might damage the parts)

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






There are two options of style for this wheel you can choose from.

2. Finish installing the remaining screws to attach the 3. Using the multi tool screw in the center hub cap.




General Assembly




Sandwich the tire with the center beadlock ring installed in between the front and back half of the wheel. Make sure you line up the five screw holes when placing the wheel together. Note: do not tighten one screw down in one go. Tighten each screw down bit by bit in the sequence

Option 1




1. For the first option, use thin spacer (5x8x1) and spring washer in between the nut and the wheel to fasten it, with multi tool provided which is also a wheel hex



4. Make sure it is tightened and secure by putting a driver that fits through the hole for a bit more leverage. (Note do not over tight as this might damage the parts)

Attention: after use in muddy conditions please wash wheels before removing center hub cap to prevent grit and sand from damaging the threads.
